DISCUSSION	
Read Numbers 24:17. In what ways does this verse refer to Jesus and His birth?	
How does this cause you to worship even more this Christmas?	
In what ways is it important to know God prior to worshipping Him?	
How does our worship arise as a response to the truth of who God is and what He has done?	
■ What's the difference between worshipping God for what He can do for me in contrast to what He has already done and who He is?	
Read Isaiah 9:6–7, John 1:49, and Revelation 19:16. How do these passages inform our understanding of the Christmas events and who our Messiah is?	
■ Based on your worship during the Christmas season, what propels and compels your worship the most?	
Read Romans 12:1. Worship might feel like a feeling. It might seem distant or ethereal. However, how does this passage inform us on what worship includes on a practical level?	
■ How is it that Christmas time and season can be even more challenging regarding cultivating a heart of worship? How can we address this? What should we do?
