Believing that something good
can come out of something bad

READ PSALM 46:11

DAY 1

This month is all about hope—believing something good can come out of something bad. Ultimately, we can have hope because God is with us. And He is more powerful than anything!

Find a corner of your room and build a fort. You can use chairs and blankets, a blanket over a table, or even a camping tent. Check with your guardian to make sure it's okay to set up your fort and leave it that way all month long. Take your Bible, some index cards or pieces of paper, a pen, some clear tape and your GodTime card into your fort. Make this your go to spot each day where you spend time with God.

Write out today's verse on your piece of paper and tape it up somewhere inside your fort.

THANK God for the hope we have knowing that He is always with us.

READ PSALM 46:1

DAY 2

Think of places you go to for safety. Maybe it's your room or sitting next to your parent. Even though you cannot see God, you can always go to Him for help. You can talk to Him anytime, anywhere. You can open His word and read His promises. And you can worship Him with your small group at church.

Write out today's verse and tape it up in your fort as a reminder that God will give you strength and is always there to help in times of need. Whatever happens, remember how powerful God is.

ASK God to remind you that when trouble comes, He is with you.

READ PROVERBS 18:10

DAY 3

Grab a set of Jenga® pieces or wooden blocks. Take them into your fort and build a tower. Be careful, one wrong move and the whole tower will topple!

Aren't you glad that God isn't like that tower of blocks? He is our strong tower. Literally nothing can defeat Him. He is more powerful than any superhero, stronger than the biggest storm, and more loving than we could ever imagine. You can always run to Him for protection when you need help.

Write out the words of today's verse and tape it up inside your fort.

LOOK for opportunities to call on God for help, remembering that His is your strong tower of safety.

READ PSALM 27:1

DAY 4

Grab a flashlight and turn out the lights in the room where you've built your fort. Take your flashlight into your fort to complete your GodTime today.

What does a light do? When it's dark, a light shows you what is there. The light keeps you safe so you don't trip and fall over something that might get in the way. The Lord is our light. We don't have to fear anything because He is always our safe place.

Write out the words of today's verse and tape it up in your fort. Read over the rest of the verses from this week as a reminder that you can have hope, no matter what happens because God is more powerful than anything.

KNOW that God is with you and will always show you where to go.
