# SENIOR PASTOR

Leading a church in Colorado is like living the spiritual version of "Black Hawk Down." The 1993 movie told the story of the U.S. sending special forces into Somalia. Their mission was to destabilize the government and bring food and aid to the starving population. An unexpected attack by Somalian forces brought down two Black Hawk helicopters. From there, the U.S. soldiers must struggle to regain their balance and withstand heavy gunfire.

Our culture is the spiritual version of that hostile backdrop. The unseen enemy of Satan and his forces are taking shots at us. We are trying to help people with the Good News of the Gospel and efforts in the name of Christ, yet not everyone accepts what we are doing. In all things, we will not give up.

The last two years have been some of the most challenging years of church ministry. Navigating a pandemic and traversing life after it has been full of twists and turns, yet our church has gotten stronger through it all. Those who have stuck with us and whom we have gained have a solid resolve to be here. The financial strength of our church has grown over a quarter of a million since 2019. We have broadened our reach for Christ despite setbacks and distractions.

# In 2021, we said that we would focus on the following:

**Being known:** We launched membership and created more intentional systems for care while strengthening our Connections Ministry.

**Growing deep:** We worked to launch more small groups and create discipleship pathways for every stage of spiritual maturity.

**Bringing hope:** Our Counseling Ministry grew and continued to be on the front lines of people's lives, along with our Life Connect ministries, to apply the truth of Scripture and the power of Jesus to everyday life.

**Engaging culture:** We have begun training and furthered efforts in our ministries to bring practical ways of applying God's truth to the world around us.

Through the efforts of our staff, elders, deacons, lay leaders, and members, we have seen a significant impact in these strategic ministry areas.

In the pages of this report, you will see the faithfulness of God. This is not about us, our efforts, or what we were able to do. Only by God working through us can such things be accomplished. He has been so faithful!







What a pleasure it has been to serve alongside our ministry leaders, support staff, and you (our Grace Chapel community) as together we seek to live out our mission of leading people to find and follow Jesus. You will see in the pages of this report God working in and through the ministries of Grace Chapel. Operationally, we remain encouraged and can summarize our operational health by simply saying that God is faithful! Through the Lord's continued provision and blessing, we are pleased to report a number of encouraging items including:

Our weekly average worship service attendance is nearly back to prepandemic levels. Additionally, our Sunday online attendance and mid-week viewing of our weekend services on platforms such as YouTube and Facebook continue to reach hundreds of unique people each week.

We launched two new local outreach ministries (Life Connect and Apartment Connect) to better serve and reach our neighbors.

We completed a significant capital improvement project focused on replacing some of our aging heating and cooling systems in the Worship Center.

Financially, we unfortunately missed our 2021–2022 giving plan by about three percent while expenses exceeded plan by five percent, largely driven by a substantial increase in unexpected facility/property maintenance expenses. As we go forward, we will continue to watch giving and expenses closely to help ensure effective stewardship of the resources God provides.

#### LOOKING AHEAD

Looking ahead, we are excited about what God is doing and will be working hard this coming year on the following ministry themes:

Creating easy-to-navigate ways of connecting more people with Christcentered communities.

Strengthening our ability and focus on discipleship and spiritual growth.

Significantly expanding our counseling and care ministries.

Better engaging our culture with the message of the Gospel through new local and global outreach opportunities.

Together, as we sense the Lord's leading, we will be taking steps in each of these areas to better support you in your own spiritual growth and reach more people with the transformational message of the Gospel. ## LOOKING BACK

It's exciting to look back at this past year to see how God has used this mission to make a spiritual impact on both our kids and families at Grace Chapel. Let's take a look:

**Family Kits** | Family Kits was launched during the pandemic as "Sunday School in a Box" to connect kids and families with God's Word in a fun and unique way. In 2021–2022, we redeveloped Family Kits as a subscription box that ships directly to your doorstep! We have written and distributed over two years of discipleship curriculum and fun activities for families to participate together in Family Kits.

**Trunk or Treat** Our largest all-church outreach of the year. Last year's Trunk or Treat was the biggest one yet with over 1,000 kids and families in attendance.

**Child + Parent Dedication |** In our dedication service, we had 19 parents dedicate themselves to raising their children in a home that loves, honors, and serves Jesus Christ as Lord.

**VBS** | Had the privilege to share the Gospel with over 300 kids at VBS! We raised over \$1,000 toward water projects in El Salvador. Many kids responded with first-time decisions, as well as recommitments to follow Jesus with their lives. Praising God for our 100+ amazing volunteers at VBS. What a week!

**Upward Sports |** Now in its fourth season, Upward Sports is a community outreach that has impacted nearly 300 kids with an emphasis on biblical values in a setting of team sports.

**Family Team |** 2021 launched the Grace Chapel Family Team; a collaboration across multiple ministries (including GCKids) with the whole family in mind. We seek to provide opportunity for parents to grow as the spiritual leaders of their children.

**THRIVE Parenting Conerence** | Thrive is a LIVE parenting seminar hosted by Dr. Scott Turansky and Joanne Miller (RN, BSN). A biblical approach to parenting your child's heart. We had over 60 join us!

**Raising Screen Time Kids** | Live Seminar hosted by Pastor Josh Weidmann, provided many good insights, encouragements and biblical principles for parenting in a device–saturated world.

Women's Ministry has experienced God's faithfulness in countless ways over the past 12 months. As sisters, we committed to pray for one another, discuss God's Word with one another, and support one another through the challenges and heartaches that the world's events brought. July of 2021 found us celebrating His goodness and thanking Him for the ways He sustained us and grew us. Our 2021 Soiree was the first non-worship service event held in the Worship Center... and what an event! We welcomed 110 women to a Garden Party that the Lord used to touch hearts and motivate women from all different ages and backgrounds to get involved in community and serving others.

That event kicked off another year of ministry: Study Together Bible studies diving into the depths of God's faithfulness through the book of Exodus, Life Together groups sharing friendship and teaching in homes and on campus, and the launch of our new mom's group, Life Together: Moms. Over 160 women have met on a weekly or semiweekly basis, illustrating the truth of our Women's Ministries' banner: Better Together. We thrive when we press into community, and we grow when we press into God's Word.

This year we've seen the faithfulness of our community and experienced the faithfulness of God. Though we face much uncertainty in our world, the resilience of our Grace community propelled our mission forward.

Our budgeted giving for the end of the fiscal year, June 2022, was \$3.2 million. We received a total of \$3.1 million and though this is just shy of our expectations, we have much to be thankful for. Our world is facing an extraordinary amount of uncertainty and despite this, the faith of our community proved that we need not fear and only draw closer to Christ.

Our expenses came in higher than normal as we experienced inflationary pressures as well as addressing substantially higher facility related costs. We also chose to invest in and empower many ministries such as Apartment Connect, growing communities, and several other ministry opportunities which you can read in the rest of this report.

We invested heavily into our IT infrastructure and are continually looking for ways to improve our church home. We recognize the many opportunities to improve our home and are being deliberate in the stewardship of our resources to best meet the needs of our campus while remaining effective in Leading People to Find and Follow Jesus.

While there is always more that can be done in communities to share and live the Gospel, I have a greater faith now in our congregation...that when hard times come, we are together, propelling the Gospel forward and seeking to help others find and follow Jesus.

We are now nearly 900 episodes in since the November 2018 launch. The digital podcast has seen around thousands of unique downloads. While exact numbers are difficult to track from terrestrial radio, the stories shared have not just revealed encouragement but life transformation! We have seen attenders of Grace Chapel whose presence is a direct result of having been introduced to us through listening to Gospel Daily on the radio. We've also received messages from those who cannot attend in person but are being uplifted and encouraged through this unique ministry. We also air digitally via podcast on iTunes and Spotify.

We are excited to keep growing this platform, especially on the digital side! Seeing the reach it has had with very little marketing indicates to us that God is using this ministry to meet a need in people's lives. We'd like to see it grow in depth and effectiveness through added resources and intentional marketing. We eventually want people to receive Gospel Daily through written, audio, and video content.

Locally, we started two initiatives. Apartment Connect, a dedicated and passionate team, host many events of their own to connect with the people in the APEX Apartments. Events such as Welcome Home for the Apex Apartments, is a tangible way for us to show we care for our community. Our one Bible study at Apex is going well and we continue to expand our spiritual influence with those involved. Life Connect seeks to care for people over a longer period of time. It moves us away from the more short-term, relief-type ministry of a Winter Night event into deeper interactions with hurting people and helps influence them with the ability to maintain a more sustainable lifestyle. Life Connect gives us more time to speak truth into their lives and to pray consistently for people as they go through the program.

## LOOKING BACK

Established and completed the pilot program of Life Connect.

Purchased a tent for the Apex Community events.

Embraced two new countries for Our Global Ministry: Malawi and Israel.

Sent out a missionary family to Indonesia.

Established a Community Connect Leadership Team in partnership with Connections, Youth, and Kids.

Established monthly events at Apex with the Apartment Connect Team as well as a soccer team from Apex.

Promoted the need for the Ukrainian Refugee Crisis and raised significant money.

#### **Community Connect**

Grace Chapel Outreach continues to look for new ways to connect with our community in a caring way to lead people to find and follow Jesus in 2023.

In addition to Apartment Connect and Life Connect, we hope to establish a third space in the form of a local community Coffee Shop on Grace Chapel property, where we can host events, have conversations on key topics, and meet people around a good cup of coffee.



**GLOBAL UPDATE** 

**El Salvador** | We are sending out our first team of missionaries to North Africa from El Salvador. One team is heading out in September on a three-month training program for Muslim Outreach and the other is a long-term couple going out with Operation Mobilization to Spain with an emphasis on reaching Muslim people with the Gospel.

Malawi | In November 2021, Grace Chapel accepted Brothers In Arms Initiative as a new Africa partner project. Brothers In Arms Initiative is a Malawian registered Christian non-profit led by Pastor Asante Masanche. They seek to connect with street-connected youth, through Christ to transform them into responsible citizens. During the 2021–2022 fiscal year, Grace Chapel gave \$29,934.17 to Brothers In Arms. These funds combined with other donations helped Brothers In Arms complete the first phase of their Residential Impact Center.

**Israel** | We are still in the process of planning for a new work in Israel. As yet, we have not set any plans in motion.

**Lebanon** | We have been involved in an exciting ministry in Lebanon with Light House Ministries, funding media production and Christian radio programs that go all across the Middle East.

**China** | In 2021, we wrapped up our work in China with the exception of some clean water projects and some student sponsorship. The Chinese government has made it very difficult to do ministry in China. We still support one couple that has managed to ride the wave of expulsions and are faithfully pressing on.
